Poets' Voices for Liberty by Martha Horton and Kaye Newbury. Martha Horton was the former Editor of *The Chemung Valley Reporter*, and P.R. and Publications Director at Elmira College and Corning Community College. Kaye Newbury is author of the chapbook *The Way She Looks Now*, and her poetry has been published in *The Healing Muse* and *Pitkin Review*. Martha Horton will review *Emma Lazarus* by Esther Schor and *The New Colossus*, a tribute to the Statue of Liberty in 1833. Newbury will introduce other American poets from Lazarus to the present century, whose poems spoke to the nation's social conscience and helped shaped America's vision of itself.

Heroes in the Skies: American Aviators in World War II by Ian Darling—Reviewed by George Myfelt. George Myfelt served in the 14th Army Air Force - Flying Tigers and is a retired teacher and school administrator. Upon retirement, he worked as a pit lane security supervisor at Watkins Glen International race track.
