The author, a personal friend, records Craig Claiborne's tremendous influence on the American diet. "He was a meek, mild man from Sunflower, Mississippi, who revolutionized cooking". November 2

The Latest and Greatest in Children's Books will be discussed by Librarian Caroline Poppendeck. When was the last time you read a story aloud? The Children's Librarian at CCLD will outline booklists for different age groups and show how to use web sites and blogs to review books. Let's keep our children reading this winter!

William D. Pawley, The Extraordinary Life of the Adventurer, Entrepreneur, and Diplomat Who Cofounded the Flying Tigers will be reviewed by the author Anthony Carrozza. This is an in depth biography of Pawley, described as "a cross between Indiana Jones and Donald Trump", who was a man who influenced 30 years of American & European relationships during WWII and the Cold War.

All reviews are held Fridays from 12:00 - 1 PM in the Steele Memorial Library Auditorium.
